# LANCASTER HERITAGE GUIDE

Lancaster has a rich heritage dating right back to Roman times.

A Roman fort once stood on the site of Lancaster Castle which itself has dominated the Lancaster skyline for almost 1.000 years. In Georgian times, Lancaster thrived due to its part in the triangular slave trade with Africa and the West Indies. This is when many key heritage buildings were built including Dalton Square, the Old Town Hall, which is now the City Museum, and the Custom House on St George's Quay now the Maritime Museum. The museums are two of several places in which you can learn about the city's history.

This guide highlights some of the finest heritage features of the city alongside some lesser-known hidden gems. We hope you enjoy exploring our wonderful city and discovering its rich heritage as well as the unique range of businesses which continue to make Lancaster such a special place.
